



KNITTING PATTERN

Frosted Violets

Shawlette

MATERIALS

1 skein of **Soft Alpaca** color 11 (A)
1 skein of **Friends Kid Silk** color 67 (B)

Circular needle 3.75 mm, 40 cm /US 5, 16"
Scissors
Tapestry needle
Removable stitch markers (optional)

YARN QUALITY

 **Soft Alpaca**, Hobbii

100 % Alpaca
50 g / 1.76 oz = 165 m / 180.45 yds

 **Friends Kid Silk**, Hobbii

72 % Mohair, 25 % Silk, 3 % Wool
25 g / 0.88 oz = 200 m / 218.72 yds

GAUGE

20 sts x 28 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4 " x 4 "
in Stockinette Stitch pattern with both
yarns held together

SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Depth: 26.25 cm / 10.5"
Length: 142 cm / 56"

PATTERN INFORMATION

Frosted Violets is a skinny shawlette knit in Stockinette Stitch worked from point to point. Beginning with a few cast-on stitches, increases are made along the right side edge every four rows until the correct depth of the shawlette is achieved. Then decreases are made along the same edge until the shawlette is complete. The pattern alternates eight rows of Soft Alpaca and Kid Silk held together with a two-row skinny stripe in just Kid Silk. The first and last stitches of every row are worked in Garter Stitch.

This pattern is beginner friendly.

Note! This pattern uses nearly all of both skeins. If you think you might like to make this larger be sure to prepare ahead of time by acquiring extra skeins.

ABBREVIATIONS

CO = cast on

BO = bind off

K = knit

Kfb = knit through the front and back on same st (1 st increased)

P = Purl

Patt = pattern

Rep = repeat

RS = right side

St(s) = stitch(es)

Ssk = slip, slip, knit: slip 2 sts one at a time knit-wise to the right hand needle; return sts to left hand needle in turned position and knit them together through the back loops (1 st decreased)

WS = wrong side

INFO AND TIPS

Garter Stitch

All Rows: Knit.

Stockinette Stitch

Row 1 (RS): Knit.

Row 2 (WS): Purl.

Tips

1. This pattern uses nearly all of both skeins. If you think you might like to make this larger (which is easy to do!) be sure to prepare ahead of time by acquiring extra skeins.
2. A handy way to keep track of rows (and therefore, where you are in the pattern) is by placing a removable stitch marker every ten rows.
3. I also recommend using a different colored removable stitch marker or progress marker to keep track of when to decrease/increase.
4. Please take the time to swatch to obtain the correct gauge. Block your swatch as you intend to block the shawllette. Wet blocking will cause this shawllette to expand several



cm / inches in length. I find that it is the best method for blocking as it helps the stitches to settle nicely and creates the most polished finish.

PATTERN

With A and B held together, CO 2 sts using the long-tail cast-on method or preferred method of cast-on.

Row 1 (RS): Kfb, k1. [3 sts]

Row 2 (WS): K1, p1, k1.

Row 3: Knit.

Row 4: K1, p1, k1.

Row 5: Kfb, knit to end. [4 sts]

Row 6: K1, p2, k1.

Row 7: Knit.

Row 8: K1, p2, k1.

Drop A for the next 2 rows, but do not cut.

Row 9: With B only, kfb, knit to end. [5 sts]

Row 10: With B only, k1, purl to last st, k1.

Hold A and B together for the next 8 rows.

Row 11: Knit.

Row 12: K1, purl to last st, k1.

Row 13: Kfb, knit to end. [6 sts]

Row 14: K1, purl to last st, k1.

Row 15: Knit.

Row 16: K1, purl to last st, k1.

Row 17: Kfb, knit to end. [7 sts]

Row 18: K1, purl to last st, k1.

Drop A for the next 2 rows, but do not cut.

Row 19: With B only, knit.

Row 20: With B only, k1, purl to last st, k1.

Hold A and B together for the next 8 rows.

Row 21: Kfb, knit to end. [8 sts]

Row 22: K1, purl to last st, k1.

Row 23: Knit.

Row 24: K1, purl to last st, k1.

Row 25: Kfb, knit to end. [9 sts]

Row 26: K1, purl to last st, k1.

Row 27: Knit.

Row 28: K1, purl to last st, k1.



Continue working in patt alternating 8 rows of A/B held together with 2 rows of just B. *At the same time*, increase as established every fourth row along the right edge until 200 rows total have been worked and there are 52 sts, ending with 2 rows of just B.

Hold A and B together for the next 8 rows.

Row 201: K1, ssk, knit to end. [51 sts]

Row 202: K1, purl to last st, k1.

Row 203: Knit.

Row 204: K1, purl to last st, k1.

Row 205: K1, ssk, knit to end. [50 sts]

Row 206: K1, purl to last st, k1.

Row 207: Knit.

Row 208: K1, purl to last st, k1.

Drop A for the next 2 rows, but do not cut.

Row 209: With B only, k1, ssk, knit to end. [49 sts]

Row 210: With B only, k1, purl to last st, k1.

Continue working in patt alternating 8 rows of A/B held together with 2 rows of just B. *At the same time*, decrease as established every fourth row along the right edge until 390 rows total have been worked and there are 4 sts, ending with 2 rows of just B.

Hold A and B together for the last 9 rows.

Row 391: Knit.

Row 392: K1, purl to last st, k1.

Row 393: K1, ssk, k1. [3 sts]

Row 394: K1, p1, k1.

Row 395: Knit.

Row 396: K1, p1, k1.

Row 397: K1, ssk. [2 sts]

BO purlwise.

FINISHING

Weave in loose ends.

Block to measurements using the wet blocking technique.
