



KNITTING PATTERN

PLANESWALKER MITTENS

NOTES

These mittens are knitted from the cuff, starting with a twisted rib and then the two color pattern starts.

There are increases for the thumb gusset in order to make them fit the hand better.

The thumb is a knit in thumb. The pattern includes a link to a video tutorial for this type of thumb.

You can knit these in any color combination you'd like, but if they're a gift for someone who plays *Magic: The Gathering* I suggest using similar colors to the ones I used unless the reciever have specifically requested other colors.

You can easily change the size by going up or down a needle size or using a thicker or thinner yarn. Note that changing needles or thickness of yarn may change amount of yarn needed.

NEEDLES & YARN








2.5 mm / US 1.5 circular or double pointed needles (DPNs)

Gauge: 34 stitches x 33 rows (10x10 cm / 4x4 in blocked)

Main color (mc): 60 grams 2 ply fingering wool

Contrast color (cc): 50 grams 2 ply fingering wool

CHART SYMBOLS & ABBREVIATIONS

-  Match the arrow on chart C with the arrow on chart A/B when beginning the thumb
-  K2tog - knit 2 together
-  Ktbl - knit through back loop
-  No stitch - appears either before an increase or after a decrease in the pattern
-  P - purl
-  Ssk - slip 2 stitches knitwise, transfer back to left needle and knit together through back loop
-  Yo - yarn over, knit twisted on next round to avoid holes

PATTERN

Cast on 60 stitches with mc, and divide them onto you needles as follows:

Magic loop with circular needles:

34 stitches for the back of the hand

26 stitches for the palm

DPNs:

Right mitten: 17, 17, 9, 17

Left mitten: 17, 17, 17, 9

Join round, careful not to twist the stitches and knit the twisted rib: *Ktb, p* - repeat *-* until end of round. Repeat for 15 rounds total or until desired length of cuff is reached. Continue with chart A for right mitten, or chart B for left mitten.

Make sure to catch your floats where there's longer sections of one color. I usually catch my floats every 5th stitch by wrapping the yarns around each other on the back. Avoid catching the float on the same stitch on the next round in order to keep the floats invisible.

When you reach the red line in the pattern it's time for the knit in thumb. Knit the next 11 stitches with a piece of scrap yarn in a contrasting color, then slip them back to left needle and continue with the pattern according to the chart. This is where you'll pick up stitches for the thumb later.

At the end of the chart; cut the yarn and pull through the remaning stitches to secure them.

Thumbs:

Pick up 11 stitches on each side of the contrasting yarn. Start at the arrows and knit one round according to chart C, while at the same time picking up 1 stitch at each side of the thumb to prevent holes.

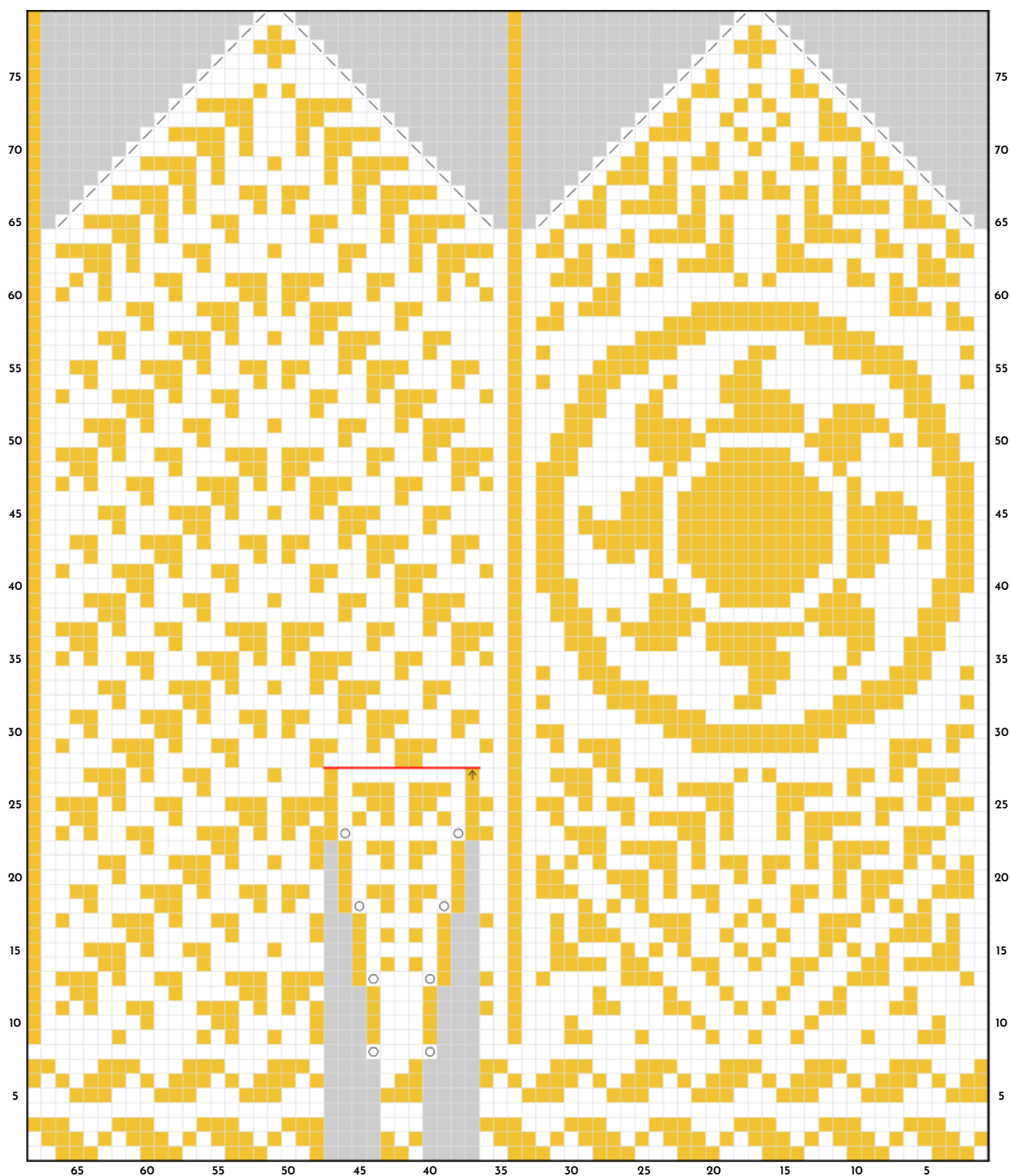
At the end of the chart; cut the yarn and pull through the remaining stitches to secure them.

Weave in and trim ends. Wash and block your mittens to even out the stitches.

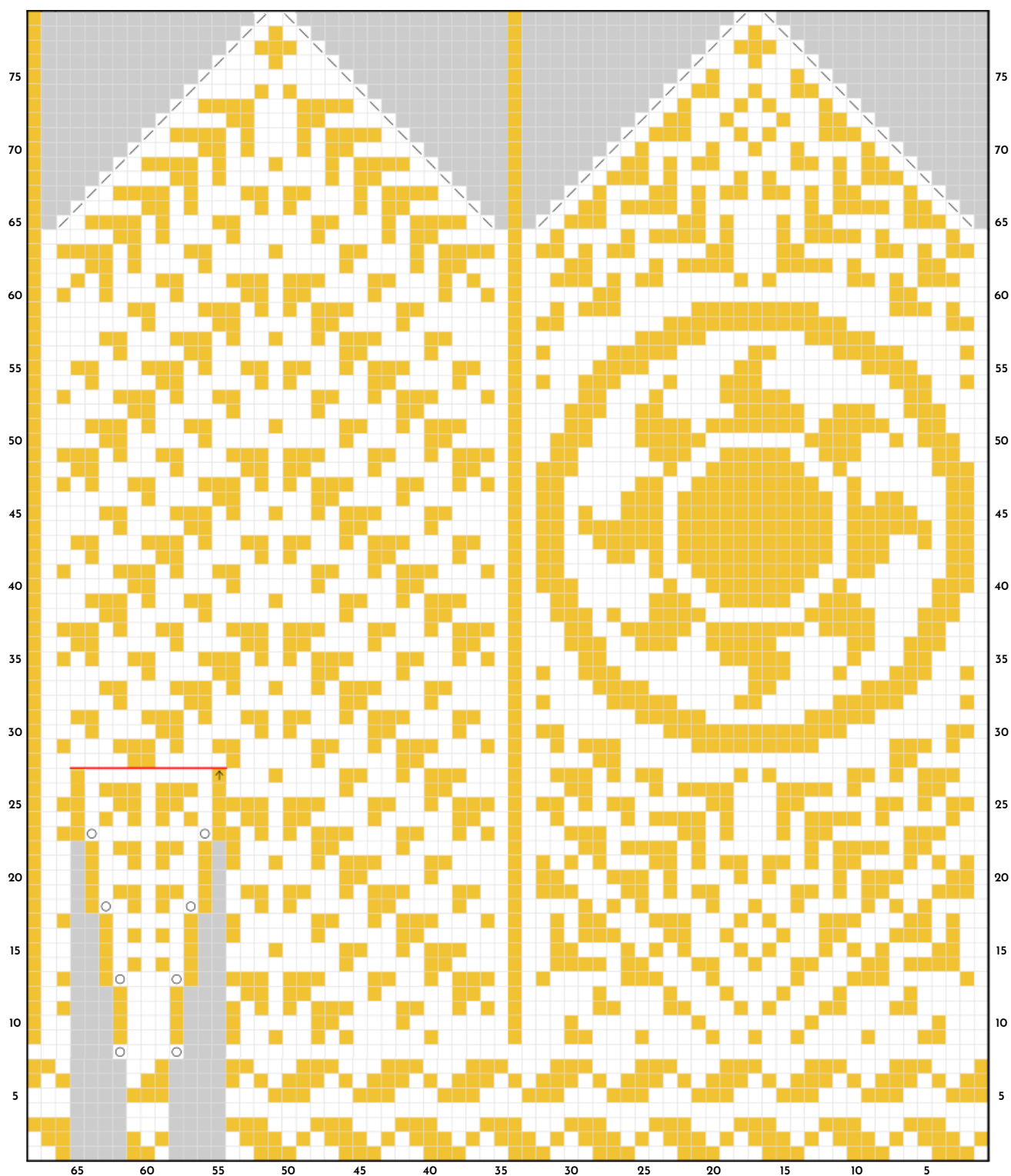

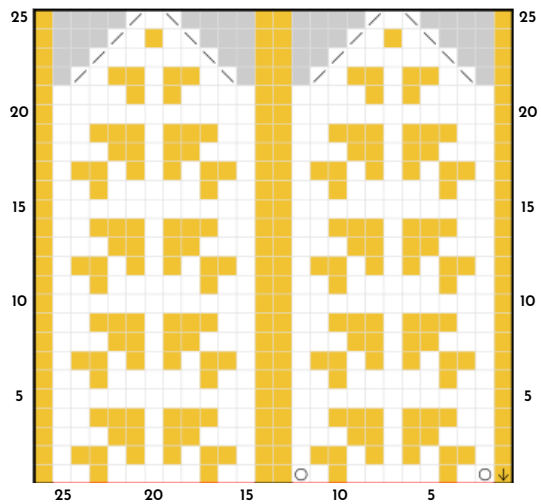
