


# Short scarf Dryad

## Design and pattern instructions © 2017 Tashashu Gordon

### **Abbreviations:**

BO = bind off  
CO = cast on  
k = knit  
k2tog= knit two (2) stitches together  
k3tog= knit three (2) stitches together  
p = purl  
RN= right needle  
LN= left needle  
RS = right side  
rep = repeat  
sl1k = slip a stitch knit-wise  
st(s) = stitch (es)  
tbl = through back loop  
w&t = wrap and turn  
WS = wrong side  
w/o = without  
wyib = with yarn in back.  
/ = next



### **Yarn:**

**A** – Zitron Filigran Lace №1- 600m/100g (col. 2511) - **70g**  
**B** – Zitron Filigran Color Lace №1 - 600m/100g (col. 77) - **100g**

**Size:** wide – 36cm. / long - 110cm. (or optional)


**Needles:** 2- 2,5mm, circular needles – 2-2,5mm

**Gauge:** 34sts and 40 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm

**Note:** I used “wrap and turn” (knit the indicated number of sts, wrap working yarn around next stitch, turn and knit back in the opposite direction), but any other short-row turn works just as well. Selvedge stitches are already included in this stitch count. Do not add any additional selvedge stitches. This scarf is knitted seamlessly.

The scarf can be closed with a brooch or shawl pin or, during the last strip, you can incorporate a buttonhole and sew on a large pretty button.

**Attention! - For photo-tutorial I've CO 130sts (yarn: A – Zitron Filisilk col. 3038, B – Zitron Filigran Color Lace №1 col. 77).**



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### Row-by row description:


#### Yarn "A"

CO 260sts (multiple of 65) and purl one row.

#### Strip 1: (turquoise color on the Schematics 1, 2)

This stage of work includes many "w&t", that's why I recommend using short right needle.


#### Part 1 (leaf): \*K29, w&t/ k28, w&t

**Yarn "B":** K27, w&t/ k26, w&t/ (k13, w&t/ k11, w&t) x 6 times/ k12, w&t/ (k13, w&t/ k11, w&t) x 5 times/ k13, w&t/ k25, w/o turning, slip 27sts from RN to LN (wyib), (photos 1, 1a), w/o turning

**Yarn "A":** K28, w&t/ p29, turn work, (photo 1b).



**Part 2 (triangle):** Sl1k, k18, w&t/ k18, p1/ sl1k, k15, w&t/ k15, p1/ sl1k, k12, w&t/ k12, p1/ sl1k, k9, w&t/ k9, p1/ sl1k, k7, w&t/ k7, p1/ sl1k, k5, w&t/ k5, p1/ sl1k, k4, w&t/ k4, p1/ sl1k, k6, w&t/ k6, p1/ sl1k, k8, w&t/ k8, p1/ sl1k, k11, w&t/ k11, p1/ sl1k, k13, w&t/ k13, p1/ sl1k, k16, w&t/ k16, p1/ sl1k, k17, w&t/ p18, turn work, (photo 2), BO 15sts (1st remaining on RN), (photo 2a), w/o turning




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
**Part 3 (leaf):** K28, w&t/ k28, w&t/ slip 12sts from LN to RN (wyib), (photos 3, 3a), w/o turning

**Yarn “B”:** K15, w&t/ K26, w&t/ (k13, w&t/ k11, w&t) x 6 times/ k12, w&t/ (k13, w&t/ k11, w&t) x 5 times/ k13, w&t/ k25, w/o turning, slip 27sts from RN to LN (wyib), (photos 3b, 3c), w/o turning

**Yarn “A”:** K28, w&t/ p29, turn work, (photo 3d).



**Part 4 (triangle):** Sl1k, k9, w&t/ k9, p1/ sl1k, k7, w&t/ k7, p1/ sl1k, k5, w&t/ k5, p1/ sl1k, k3, w&t/ k3, p1/ sl1k, k4, w&t/ k4, p1/ sl1k, k6, w&t/ k6, p1/ sl1k, k8, w&t/ k8, p1/ sl1k, k10, w&t/ p11, turn work, (photo 4), BO 20sts (1st remaining on RN), (photo 4a), w/o turning




**Part 5 (leaf):** K18, w&t/ p19, w/o turning, CO 10sts using the loop cast-on method, (photo 5), turn work; sl1k, k27, w&t/ k27, w&t/ slip 18sts from LN to RN (wyib), (photos 5a, 5b), w/o turning


**Yarn “B”:** K9, w&t/ K26, w&t/ (k13, w&t/ k11, w&t) x 6 times/ k12, w&t/ (k13, w&t/ k11, w&t) x 5 times/ k13, w&t/ k25, w/o turning, slip 27sts from RN to LN (wyib), (photos 5c, 5d), w/o turning

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**Yarn "A":** K28, w&t/ p29, turn work; BO 10sts (1st remaining on RN), (photo 5e), w/o turning




**Part 6 (triangle):** K9, w&t/ k9, p1/ sl1k, k7, w&t/ k7, p1/ sl1k, k5, w&t/ k5, p1/ sl1k, k3, w&t/ k3, p1/ sl1k, k4, w&t/ k4, p1/ sl1k, k6, w&t/ k6, p1/ sl1k, k8, w&t/ k8, p1/ sl1k, k10, w&t/ p11, turn work, (photo 6).




**Part 7 (leaf):** Sl1k, k28, w&t/ k28, w&t/ slip 19sts from LN to RN (wyib), (photos 7, 7a), w/o turning

**Yarn "B":** K8, w&t/ K26, w&t/ (k13, w&t/ k11, w&t) x 6 times/ k12, w&t/ (k13, w&t/ k11, w&t) x 5 times/ k13, w&t/ k25, w/o turning, slip 27sts from RN to LN (wyib), (photos 7b, 7c), w/o turning.


**Yarn "A":** K28, w&t/ p29, turn work.




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**Part 8 (triangle):** Sl1k, k14, w&t/ k14, p1/ sl1k, k12, w&t/ k12, p1/ sl1k, k10, w&t/ k10, p1/ sl1k, k8, w&t/ k8, p1/ sl1k, k6, w&t/ k6, p1/ sl1k, k4, w&t/ k4, p1/ sl1k, k3, w&t/ k3, p1/ sl1k, k5, w&t/ k5, p1/ sl1k, k7, w&t/ k7, p1/ sl1k, k9, w&t/ k9, p1/ sl1k, k11, w&t/ k11, p1/ sl1k, k13, w&t/ p14, turn work \*\*; BO 30sts (1st remaining on RN), w/o turning, slip 1st from RN to LN \*, (photo 8).



Repeat from \* to \* x 2 more times, repeat from \* to \*\* x 1 more time, further: Sl1k, k29, turn work. BO 30sts, (photo 9). Break yarn B.




**Continue: start on the wrong side.**

**(WS) Pick up and purl 495sts this way (Schematic 3, photo10):**


**( From Part 8- 15sts, from Part 6- 10sts, from Part 5- 10sts + 10sts, from Part 3- 10sts, from Part 4- 10sts + 10sts, from Part 2- 15sts + 15sts, from Part 7- 15sts, from Part 8- 15sts) x 3 times, + from Part 8- 15sts, from Part 6- 10sts, from Part 5- 10sts + 10sts, from Part 3- 10sts, from Part 4- 10sts + 10sts, from Part 2- 15sts + CO 15sts using the loop cast-on method.**

$$135*3+90+15=510$$

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

*Pick up and purl 495sts + CO 15sts using the loop cast-on method = 510sts*




**Part 9 (leaf):** Sl1k, \*k28, w&t/ k28, w&t

**Yarn "B":** K27, w&t/ k26, w&t/ (k13, w&t/ k11, w&t) x 6 times/ k12, w&t/ (k13, w&t/ k11, w&t) x 5 times/ k13, w&t/ k7, w/o turning, slip 9sts from RN to LN (wyib), (photo 11), w/o turning

**Yarn "A":** K27, k3tog tbl, (slip 2sts from RN to LN (wyib), k3tog tbl) x 9 times, (photo 11a), turn work

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**Part 10 (leaf):** Sl1k, k8, w&t/ k28, w&t/ k28, w&t

**Yarn "B":** K27, w&t/ k26, w&t/ (k13, w&t/ k11, w&t) x 6 times/ k12, w&t/ (k13, w&t/ k11, w&t) x 5 times/ k13, w&t/ k7, w/o turning, slip 9sts from RN to LN (wyib), (photo 12), w/o turning

**Yarn "A":** K27, k3tog tbl, (slip 2sts from RN to LN (wyib), k3tog tbl) x 9 times, (photo 12a), turn work



**Part 11 (leaf):** Sl1k, k8, w&t/ k28, w&t/ k28, w&t

**Yarn "B":** K27, w&t/ k26, w&t/ (k13, w&t/ k11, w&t) x 6 times/ k12, w&t/ (k13, w&t/ k11, w&t) x 5 times/ k13, w&t/ k12, w/o turning, slip 14sts from RN to LN (wyib), (photo 13), w/o turning

**Yarn "A":** K28, w&t/ k13, w&t



**Part 12 (leaf):**


**Yarn "B":** K27, w&t/ k26, w&t/ (k13, w&t/ k11, w&t) x 6 times/ k12, w&t/ (k13, w&t/ k11, w&t) x 5 times/ k13, w&t/ k25, w/o turning, slip 27sts from RN to LN (wyib), (photo 14), w/o turning

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**Yarn "A":** K29 \*\*, w/o turning; k 28, k3tog tbl, (slip 2sts from RN to LN (wyib), k3tog tbl) x 14 times, (photo 14a), turn work; Sl1k, k13, w&t\*.



Continued: repeat from \* to \* x 2 more times, repeat from \* to \*\* x 1 more time. Break yarn B. Purl one row (260sts), turn work, (photo 15).



**Repeat «Strips 1, 2» - 2 more times or to the desired width of the scarf. BO all sts.**

**Border (I-cord):** Pick up and purl from selvedge stitches on one side (WS) of the scarf + CO 3 sts (using the loop cast-on method), turn work.

Next: K2, k2tog tbl, [slip 3sts from RN to LN(wyib), k2, k2tog tbl] x until the end of the rows.

Don't break off yarn, continue along scarf perimeter.

Block.
