

Simple Beret

Details

This beret design is intended to be **simple and warm**, especially suitable for winter and for beginners in knitting in the round.

CONSTRUCTION

The beret is worked from the bottom up seamlessly in the round.

Starting with 1x1 rib, the brim is worked using 3.5mm / US 4 circular needles for 2cm / $\frac{3}{4}$ ".

Switch to 4mm / US 6 needles and make increases, continue working in stockinette stitch.

Once the beret reaches the desired size, work decreases every other round.

Before binding off the crown, knit the remaining stitches for several rounds to form an I-cord, then tie it onto itself.

GAUGE

22 sts x 32 rows = 10cm / 4", knitted in the round in stockinette stitch with 4mm / US 6 needles, measured **after** blocking

YARN

Lana Grossa Merino Uno (100% Merino Wool; DK weight; 125m / 136yds per 50g skein)

2 skeins in **color 29 Altrosa** or 250m / 273yds of DK weight yarn.

NEEDLES

- 4mm / US 6 needles, 50cm / 20" and 80cm / 32" length.
- 3.5mm / US 4 needles, 50cm / 20" length.

Always use the needle size that will result in the correct gauge after blocking.

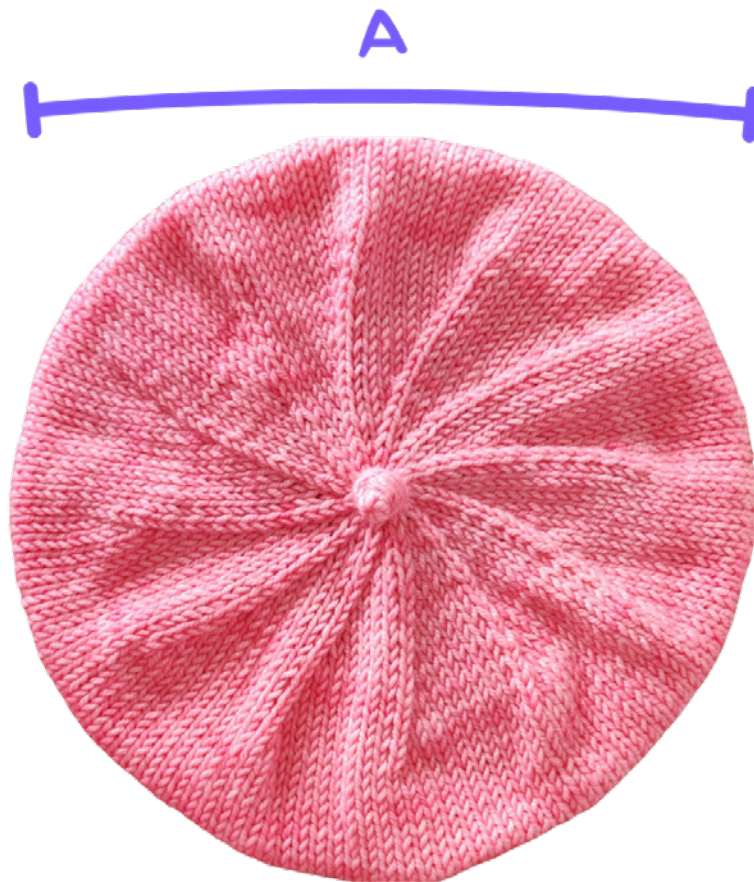
NOTIONS

1 stitch marker, tapestry needle.

Optional: Up to 62 cm / 24" of elastic thread, 11 removable stitch markers.

SIZES AND MEASUREMENTS

Size	1	2	3	4
Head circumference	39cm - 44cm 15 ³ / ₈ " - 17 ¹ / ₄ "	45cm - 50cm 17 ³ / ₄ " - 19 ³ / ₄ "	51cm - 56cm 20" - 22"	57cm - 62cm 22 ¹ / ₂ " - 24 ¹ / ₂ "
Finished brim circumference	35cm / 13 ³ / ₄ "	41cm / 16 ¹ / ₄ "	47cm / 18 ¹ / ₂ "	53cm / 21"
Diameter (A)	20cm / 8"	23cm / 9"	26cm / 10 ¹ / ₄ "	29cm / 11 ¹ / ₂ "



Abbreviations

dec Decrease

M Marker

k Knit

p Purl

kfb Knit into the front and back of a stitch

st(s) Stitch(es)

k2tog Knit 2 together

[] Repeat the instructions between brackets as many times as indicated

Before you begin

- Read all instructions carefully.
- Make sure you have achieved the correct gauge.
- To use a different yarn, make sure that it has a similar yardage as the suggested one.
- When you see instructions written as follows: 1 (2, 3, 4), follow only the number that corresponds to the size you are knitting and ignore the rest.

Pattern begins

SECTION 1 - Brim

With 3.5mm / US 4 needles and the long-tail cast on method, cast on 64 (72, 80, 88) sts.

Join in the round, being careful not to twist your stitches, and place a stitch marker to indicate the beginning of each round.

Round 1: [K1, p1] to end.

Repeat Round 1 until your work measures 2cm / $\frac{3}{4}$ ".

SECTION 2 - Base

Note: Switch to a longer cable as needed.

Change to 4mm / US 6 needles.

Increase round: [K1, kfb] to end. 96 (108, 120, 132) sts

Work in stockinette stitch until this section measures 9 (10, 11, 12) cm / $3\frac{1}{2}$ (4, $4\frac{1}{4}$, $4\frac{3}{4}$)"



SECTION 3 - Decreases

Note: Switch to DPN's or circular needle techniques if needed.

Divide your stitches equally in 12, add stitch markers between each section if you want to.

Round 1 (dec): [K6 (7, 8, 9), k2tog] to end. 84 (96, 108, 120) sts

Round 2 and all even rounds: K to end.

Round 3 (dec): [K5 (6, 7, 8), k2tog] to end. 72 (84, 96, 108) sts

Round 5 (dec): [K4 (5, 6, 7), k2tog] to end. 60 (72, 84, 96) sts

Round 7 (dec): [K3 (4, 5, 6), k2tog] to end. 48 (60, 72, 84) sts

Round 9 (dec): [K2 (3, 4, 5), k2tog] to end. 36 (48, 60, 72) sts

Round 11 (dec): [K1 (2, 3, 4), k2tog] to end. 24 (36, 48, 60) sts

Sizes 2, 3 and 4 ONLY

Round 13 (dec): [K1 (2, 3), k2tog] to end. 24 (36, 48) sts

Sizes 3 and 4 ONLY

Round 15 (dec): [K1 (2), k2tog] to end. 24 (36) sts

Size 4 ONLY

Round 17 (dec): [K1, k2tog] to end. 24 sts

All sizes

Next round: K to end.

Next round (dec): K2tog to end. 12 sts

Next round: K to end.

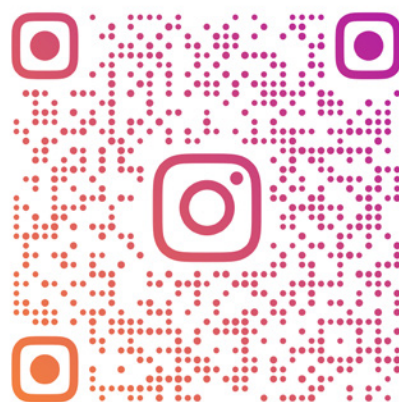
Next round (dec): K2tog to end. 6 sts

SECTION 4 - Finishing

Work in stockinette stitch until you have a 6cm / 2½" long I-cord.

Cut your yarn, thread the tail onto a tapestry needle and draw through the remaining stitches twice, pull tight to close, weave in the yarn tail through the center of the I-cord to the wrong side.

Tie the I-cord onto itself, weave in ends and block your beret, you can sew elastic thread to the brim if you want to.
