/'snō 'frōst/

the snøfrost hat is a matching project for the snøfrost jumper. they are inspired by the arctic snowflakes that find their ways onto our parka sleeves and our mittens. we enjoy watching them twirl and dance before gently landing on us. studying snowflake shapes has easily become one of our favourite past times.

pattern notes

The snøfrost hat is a stranded colourwork project. It is knitted in the round using the classic stockinette stitch and has a seamless construction. It features a folded brim for extra warmth and comes in two different sizes. The number of stitches required for size are written as S (M). The pattern includes a colourwork chart, which is read from bottom to top and right to left. The pattern repeat for the design is 8 sts. Should you need to modify the hat for a bigger size, co extra 8 sts. And if you need to make a smaller hat, co 8 sts less than the recommended size.

YARN

Suggested yarn
Georgian Bay Fibres Co BFL

Weight - DK

Colour option 1 (right sample)
MC - Brookland's Wine
CC - Britt Antler

Colour option 2 (left sample)
MC - Macfie Maple
CC - Britt Antler

CIRCULAR NEEDLE

3.25mm/US 3
3.5/US 4

WIRE LENGTH

40 cm / 16"

GAUGE

28 sts x 26 rows by 10cm x 4" on larger
needle and colour-work

NOTIONS

stitch marker
tapestry needle

ABBREVIATIONS

bor - beginning of round
co - cast on
cc - contrasting colour
k - knit
p - purl
k2tog - knit two stitches together
mc - main colour
pm - place marker
st(s) - stitch(es)
* - repeat between

SKILLS

Level - intermediate
Join and knit in the round
Stranded colourwork knitting
Decreasing
Weaving ends in

begin pattern

Using smaller needles, co 128 (136) with mc.

Join in the round and pm to mark bor.

Start brim. *k1, p1* until you reach 9.5cm/3.75" from co edge.

Fold brim in half when ribbing is completed.

body (chart)

Knit all sts on chart unless stated otherwise.

Chart is read from bottom to top, right to left.

decreases

Round 39: *k6, k2tog*. 16 decreases (17 decreases).

You should have 112 (119) sts.

Round 40: k all sts

Round 41: *k5, k2tog* 16 decreases (17 decreases).

You should have 96 (102) sts.

Round 42: k all sts

Round 43: *k4, k2tog* 16 decreases (17 decreases).

You should have 80 (85) sts.

Round 44: k all sts

Round 45: *k3, k2tog* 16 decreases (17 decreases).

You should have 64 (68) sts.

Round 46: k all sts

Round 47: *k2, k2tog* 16 decreases (17 decreases).

You should have 48 (51) sts.

Round 48: k all sts

Round 49: *k1, k2tog* 16 decreases (17 decreases).

You should have 32 (34) sts.


Round 50: k all sts

Round 51: *k2tog* 16 decreases (17 decreases).

You should have 16 (17) sts.

Height of hat from folded brim to Round 51 is approximately

18cm/7" (19cm/7.5").





finishing

Cut the working yarn with at least 25.5cm/10" of tail. Attach the yarn to a tapestry needle.
Thread the yarn through all your stitches and slide them off the working needle.
When you have finished with all the stitches, pull it snugly and once you've ensured that the
stitches are secured, insert the tapestry needle into the hat.
Tie a knot and weave the remaining tail in.

Optional: Make a large, compact pompom with mc. It should measure approx. 10cm/4" in
diameter. Attach pom pom to crown of hat.

Weave in loose ends. Wet block project.

final measurements

Hat measurements with folded brim without pom pom:
height without pom pom x length across the widest section
21.5cm/9" x 21cm/8.5" (23cm/ 9.5" x 24cm/9.5")
