

# PetiteKnit

## TERRAZZO HAT



---

**Sizes:** 2-4 years (4-7 years) S (M) L

**Measurements:** Fits head circumference: 50-52 (52-54) 54-56 (56-59) 59-63 cm [19¾-20½ (20½-21¼) 21¼-22 (22-23¼) 23¼-24¾ inches]

**Gauge:** 18 sts x 26 rows = 10 x 10 cm [4 x 4 inches] in stockinette stitch on 4 mm [US6] needles  
21 sts x 31 rows = 10 x 10 cm [4 x 4 inches] in 1 x 1 rib (k1, p1) on 3.5 mm [US4] needles

**Needles:** Circular needles: 3.5 mm [US4] / 40 cm [16 inches] and 4 mm [US6] / 40 cm [16 inches]  
Double-pointed needles: 4 mm [US6]

**Materials:** **Suggestion 1:** 100 (100) 100 (100) 100 g Silk Garden by Noro (100 g = 300 m [328 yds]) **held together with** 25 (25) 25-50 (50) 50 g Silk Mohair by Isager Yarn (25 g = 212 m [232 yds])

**Suggestion 2:** 100 (100) 100-150 (150) 150 g Atlas by Sandnes Garn (50 g = 108 m [118 yds]) **or** Peruvian Highland Wool by Filcolana (50 g = 100 m [109 yds])

## PATTERN

The Terrazzo Hat is worked from the bottom up. First the hat is worked in rib and then in stockinette stitch. The folded rib edge is knitted down. The top of the hat is shaped with decreases.

### Size guide

The Terrazzo Hat fits a head circumference of 50-52 (52-54) 54-56 (56-59) 59-63 cm [19¾-20½ (20½-21¼) 21¼-22 (22-23¼) 23¼-24¾ inches].

### About decreases

The decreases are worked so they either slant to the left (skp) or to the right (k2tog). See video at [www.petiteknit.com](http://www.petiteknit.com).

**Skp:** Slip 1 stitch knitwise, k1, pass the slipped stitch over the knitted stitch.

**K2tog:** Knit 2 stitches together.

### HAT

Cast on 104 (108) 112 (120) 124 sts on a 3.5 mm [US4] / 40 cm [16 inches] circular needle.

Work in the round in 1x1 rib (k1, p1) until the work measures 17 (18) 19 (20) 21 cm [6¾ (7) 7½ (7¾) 8¼ inches].

Knit the rib edge together by knitting the sts of next round together with the cast-on edge as follows (see video at [www.petiteknit.com](http://www.petiteknit.com)):

Round 1: \* Using the right needle, lift the stitch from the cast-on edge that sits directly below the next stitch on the needle onto the left needle, knit this stitch together with the next stitch on the left needle, p1 \*, repeat from \* to \* to end of round.

This round marks the fold for the rib edge.

Work 3 cm [1¼ inch] in the round in 1x1 rib (k1, p1).

Turn the work using the German Short Rows technique (see video on [www.petiteknit.com](http://www.petiteknit.com)). This is now the RS.

Change to a 4 mm [US6] / 40 cm [16 inches] circular needle and work decreases in the next round as follows:

Round 1: \* Knit 4 (4) 5 (5) 5 sts, **k2tog**, knit 5 (5) 5 (6) 6 sts, **k2tog** \*, work from \* to \* a total of 8 times, knit to end of round. There are now a total 88 (92) 96 (104) 108 sts on the needles.

Now work in the round in stockinette stitch until the stockinette stitch section measures 9 (9) 10 (11) 11 cm [3½ (3½) 4 (4¼) 4¼ inches] from the rib edge.

Now work decreases for the crown of the hat. Change to 4 mm [US6] double-pointed needles when it becomes necessary.

Place a stitch marker for every 22nd (23rd) 24th (26th) 27th stitch to the end of the round (a total of 4 stitch markers).

Work decreases on every other round as follows:

Round 1: \* K1, **skp**, knit to 3 sts before next marker, **k2tog**, k1, slip marker \*, work from \* to \* to end of round. (8 sts have been decreased)

Round 2: Knit to end of round.

Work Rounds 1 and 2 a total of 9 (9) 10 (11) 11 times. There are now a total of 16 (20) 16 (16) 20 sts on the needle.

Work **k2tog** to end of round. There are now a total of 8 (10) 8 (8) 10 sts on the needle.

Break the working yarn and pull the end through the remaining sts on the needle.

Weave in all ends.
