My knitting philosophy is that each knitter should decide how to use their knitting time to create a knitted piece that suits their own purpose. This is why, when I design my patterns, I allow room for changes and personal modifications. Choose your own yarn weight, your own colours and knit the shawl as large or as small as you like.

Materials

Yarn

The sample shawl is knit in Navia Uno, 700 meters per 100 grams.

For a shawl measuring approx 80 cm x 220 cm the yardage is 1670 meters / 240 grams in Navia Uno.

Use any yarn; fingering or thinner 400-700 meters per 100 grams.

Other weights of yarn will affect the size and amount of yardage needed to complete the shawl.

Colours

This pattern is designed to use two colours. Colour 1 is the darker colour.

Part 1 use almost the same amount of Colour 1 and Colour 2, Part 2 use more of Colour 2, Part 3 use more of Colour 1. The sample shawl have 5 repeats of Part 2, and use almost the same amount of Colour 1 and Colour 2 in total.

This shawl invites you to play with colour. Use waste yarn and mini skeins, and make it your own.

Needles

When using the Navia Uno yarn 3,75 mm needles were used.

Choose a needle in a size that suits the yarn you have chosen and gives you a fabric and drape that you like.

Gauge

The sample shawl are knit to a gauge of approx 18 sts pr 10 cm, after blocking.

The gauge within this design is not as important as the fabric that you create. The gauge, however, does affect the size of the finished shawl. The looser the fabric, the larger the shawl and the amount of yarn used increases. The tighter you knit, the smaller the shawl and you will use less yarn.

Knitting notions

10 Stitch Markers.

1 progress keeper to mark the right side of your work.

A tapestry needle to use when weaving in the ends.

Blocking mats and wires for shaping and blocking the shawl.

Notes

It is recommended to read through the pattern before you begin. There are many tips and tricks which will be useful during knitting.

There are video tutorials which show visually the different techniques used within the shawl. Links to these are found on page 4.

Overview of the Parts of the Pattern

You will Cast on in one corner, and increase at the beginning and end of each Right Side Row for **Part 1**.

For **Part 2** you will decrease at the beginning of each Right Side Row and continue increasing at the end of each Right Side Row.

Each repeat of **Part 2** measures approximately 30 cm (this depends on your choice of yarn and needles, measure this on your own shawl)

Finish the WAVES OF WATER Shawl by decreasing at the beginning and end of each Right Side Row for **Part 3**.

Page 6-7-8-9: Explanations of the different wedge sections using German Short Rows.

The **Main Pattern** refers to the different wedge section by name, at the row they are placed. Including an explanation of how a you begin and end the different wedge sections.

Pay close attention to the finishing of the **Left Edge Wedge**. The first row following this wedge is always **purled**.

These pages should be printed out and stapled together.

Page 10-11-12-13-14-15-16: Main Pattern

On these pages, all rows are written, explaining when and how the different wedge sections should be knit.

These pages should be printed out and stapled together.

Check off each row that is knit. On all rows from the right side (and a few from the wrong side) the stitch count which should be knit is given. If you discover that you have a stitch too many or too few, decrease or increase. This will not be visible within the garter stitch.

Casting on:

Cast on 5 stitches, using "Magic Ring". This is **Row 1** on Page 10.

After you have knit a few rows, it is recommended to use a progress keeper to mark the right side of your work.

The first stitch is slipped as if to knit, purl the last stitch. . Even if this is not your usual way. This will make the changing of colours simpler and neater during the knitting of the pattern.

Be sure to keep the edge stitches loose, otherwise it will be difficult to create a nice shape of the shawl.

When using two colours you will not need to cut the yarn when changing colours. The yarn is carried along on the right edge (never more than 6 rows).

When changing colour, the last stitch on the wrong side row BEFORE colour change is purled in the next colour.

When knitting more than two rows with one colour, the carried yarn is secured just before the last stitch is purled on the wrong side row.

When you begin to knit with the other colour, stretch the edge of the work a bit, so that the edge is held loose enough for the shawl to be blocked out nicely.

Abbreviations and techniques

C1 Colour 1

C2 Colour 2

RS Right Side

WS Wrong Side

PM Place Marker

SM Stitch Marker

M/PM Move and rePlace Stitch Marker

Turn turn your work, make a Double Stitch and knit/purl back according to pattern

DS Double Stitch

DS (knitwise) **After** you have turned your work:

Hold the yarn to the back of your work and slip the first stitch knitwise.

Pull the yarn towards the front of your work, over and around the needle and to the back of your work. You have a Double Stitch on the needle. The next 2-3 stitches are knit tighter.

DS (purlwise) **After** you have turned your work:

Hold the yarn to the front of your work and slip the first stitch purlwise.

Pull the yarn towards the back of your work, over the needle and make the Double Stitch. The next 2-3 stitches are knit tighter.

st(s): stitch(es)

k1, k2, k3: knit stitches

p1, p2, p3: purl stitches

kfb knit one stitch in the front of the stitch and knit one stitch in the back of the stitch.

Yo Yarn over

k2tog: knit two stitches together.

ssk slip 1 stitch knitwise, transfer stitch back to the left needle (the stitch is now twisted), knit 2 stitches together through the back loop.

cdd: slip 2 stitches knitwise (at the same time), transfer them back to the left needle (they have switched place, and are now twisted), knit 3 stitches together through the back loop.

Sl knit: Slip 1 stitch knitwise

Row 7: Sl k, k19, PM, turn.

Row 8: DS (purlwise), p17, kfb, p1.

Row 9: Sl k, k16, PM, turn.

Row 10: DS (purlwise), p14, kfb, p1.

Row 11: Sl k, k13, PM, turn.

Row 6: DS (knitwise), k26, k2tog, p1.

Row 8: DS (knitwise), k22, k2tog, p1.

Row 9: Sl k, k2, p19, PM, turn.

Row 10: DS (knitwise), k18, k2tog, p1.

M/PM Move and rePlace Stitch Marker

Use SM to make it easier to see the DS. Place the SM on your left hand needle BEFORE you turn your work. On Rows 1-14 you will move the SM when your DS are knit/purled, and PM on your left hand needle again BEFORE you turn your work - M/PM

Row 1 (RS): k12, PM, turn,

Row 2 (WS): DS (purlwise), p11, PM, turn.

Row 3: DS (knitwise), k1, (yo, ssk) x 2, k1, (k2tog, yo) x 2, k4, M/PM, turn.

Row 4: DS (purlwise), p17, M/PM, turn.

Row 5: DS (knitwise), k5, yo, ssk, yo, cdd, yo, k2tog, yo, k8, M/PM, turn.

Row 6: DS (purlwise), p23, M/PM, turn.

Row 7: DS (knitwise), k2, (k2tog, yo) x 2, k1, (yo, ssk) x 2, k1, (k2tog, yo) x 2, k1, (yo, ssk) x 2, k5, M/PM, turn.

Row 8: DS (purlwise), p29, M/PM, turn.

Row 9: DS (knitwise), k3, (yo, cdd, yo, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, ssk) x 2, yo, cdd, yo, k6, M/PM, turn.

Row 10: DS (purlwise), p35, M/PM, turn.

Row 11: DS (knitwise), k3, [(yo, ssk) x 2, k1, (k2tog, yo) x 2, k1] x 2, (yo, ssk) x 2, k1, (k2tog, yo) x 2, k6, M/PM, turn.

Row 12: DS (purlwise), p41, M/PM, turn.

Row 13: DS (knitwise), k2, [k2tog, yo, k3, yo, ssk, yo, cdd, yo] x 3, k2tog, yo, k3, yo, ssk, k5, M/PM, turn.

Row 14: DS (purlwise), p47, M/PM, turn.

Row 15: DS (knitwise), k6, [2tog, yo, k1, (yo, ssk) x 2, k1, k2tog, yo] x 3, k2tog, yo, k1, yo, ssk, k2, PM, turn.

Row 16: DS (purlwise), p39, PM, turn.

Row 17: DS (knitwise), k6, [yo, ssk, yo, cdd, yo, k2tog, yo, k3] x 2, yo, ssk, yo, cdd, yo, k2tog, yo, k2, PM, turn.

Row 18: DS (purlwise), p31, PM, turn.

Row 19: DS (knitwise), k6, (k2tog, yo) x 2, k1, (yo, ssk) x 2, k1, (k2tog, yo) x 2, k1, (yo, ssk) x 2, k2, PM, turn.

Row 20: DS (purlwise), p23, PM, turn.

Row 21: DS (knitwise), k8, yo, ssk, yo, cdd, yo, k2tog, yo, k4, PM, turn.

Row 22: DS (purlwise), p15, PM, turn.

Row 23: DS (knitwise), k15 and return to Main Pattern

Use SM to make it easier to see the DS. Place the SM on your left hand needle BEFORE you turn your work. On Rows 1-12 you will move the SM when your DS are knit/purled, and PM on your left hand needle again BEFORE you turn your work - M/PM

Row 2 (WS): DS (purlwise), p11, PM, turn.

Row 3: DS (knitwise), k15, M/PM, turn.

Row 7: DS (knitwise), k31, M/PM, turn.

Row 8: DS (purlwise), p35, M/PM, turn.

Row 36 (C1): Sl k, k37, p1 in C2.

Row 38 (C2): Sl k, k39, p1 in C1.

Row 40 (C1): Sl k, k41, p1 in C2.

Row 42 (C2): Sl k, k43, p1 in C1.

Leave C1 and move the stitches back to the other end of your circular needle to be knit again, this time using C2 (from the right side).

Knit **Right Edge Wedge Increase in C2**. When **Right Edge Wedge Increase** is finished, the stitches are moved back to the other end of your circular needle, to continue with C1 on the wrong side.

Row 44 (C1): Sl k, p55. **Note**: the first stitch **after** each SM is a Double Stitch (DS) and is purled as ONE stitch. Remove the SM as you purl the DS.

Row 45 (C1): Sl k, kfb, k52, kfb, p1. (58 sts)

Row 47 (C2): Sl k, kfb, k54, kfb, p1. (60 sts)

Row 49 (C1): Sl k, kfb, k56, kfb, p1. (62 sts)

Row 51 (C2): Sl k, kfb, k58, kfb, p1. (64 sts)

Row 53 (C1): Sl k, kfb, k60, kfb, p1. (66 sts)

Row 46 (C1): Sl k, k56, p1 in C2.

Row 48 (C2): Sl k, k58, p1 in C1.

Row 50 (C1): Sl k, k60, p1 in C2.

Row 52 (C2): Sl k, k62, p1 in C1.

Knit **Left Edge Wedge Increase in C1**

Row 54 (C1): Sl k, k73, p1 in C2. (75 sts) **Note**: the last stitch **before** each SM is a Double Stitch (DS) and is knit as ONE stitch. Remove the SM as you knit the DS.

Row 55 (C2): Sl k, kfb, k71, kfb, p1. (77 sts)

Row 56 (C2): Sl k, k75, p1 in C1.

Row 57 (C1): Sl k, kfb, k73, kfb, p1. (79 sts)

Row 59 (C1): Sl k, kfb, k75, kfb, p1. (81 sts)

Row 61 (C1): Sl k, kfb, k77, kfb, p1. (83 sts)

Row 62 (C1): Sl k, k81, p1 in C2.

Row 63 (C2): Sl k, kfb, k35

Knit Lace Wedge in C2

When **Lace Wedge** is finished, knit to last 2 stitches of **Row 63**: kfb, p1. (85 sts)

Note: (Row 63 and Row 64) The last stitch **before** a SM is a DS and is knit as ONE stitch. Remove SM as you knit the DS.

Row 64 (WS) (C2): Sl k, k83, p1 in C1.

Row 65 (C1): Sl k, kfb, k81, kfb, p1. (87 sts)

Row 67 (C1): Sl k, kfb, k83, kfb, p1. (89 sts)

Row 69 (C1): Sl k, kfb, k85, kfb, p1. (91 sts)

Row 70 (C1): Sl k, k89, p1 in C2.

Row 71 (C2): Sl k, kfb, k87, kfb, p1. (93 sts)

Row 72 (C2): Sl k, k91, p1 in C1.

Row 73 (C1): Sl k, kfb, k89, kfb, p1. (95 sts)

Row 75 (C1): Sl k, kfb, k91, kfb, p1. (97 sts)

Row 77 (C1): Sl k, kfb, k93, kfb, p1. (99 sts)

Row 78 (C1): Sl k, k97, p1 in C2.

Row 79 (C2): Sl k, kfb, k95, kfb, p1. (101 sts)

Leave C2 and move the stitches back to the other end of your circular needle to be knit again, this time using C1 (from the right side).

Knit **Right Edge Wedge Increase in C1**. When **Right Edge Wedge Increase** is finished, the stitches are moved back to the other end of your circular needle, to continue with C2 on the wrong side.

Row 80 (C2): Sl k, p108. **Note:** the first stitch **after** each SM is a Double Stitch (DS) and is purled as ONE stitch. Remove the SM as you purl the DS.

Row 81 (C2): Sl k, kfb, k106, kfb, p1. (112 sts)

Row 82 (C2): Sl k, k110, p1 in C1.

Row 83 (C1): Sl k, kfb, k108, kfb, p1. (114 sts)

Row 84 (C1): Sl k, k112, p1 in C2.

Row 85 (C2): Sl k, kfb, k110, kfb, p1. (116 sts)

Row 86 (C2): Sl k, k114, p1 in C1.

Row 87 (C1): Sl k, kfb, k112, kfb, p1. (118 sts)

Row 88 (C1): Sl k, k116, p1 in C2.

Row 89 (C2): Sl k, kfb, k114, kfb, p1. (120 sts)

Knit Left Edge Wedge Increase in C2

Row 90 (C2): Sl k, k127, p1 in C1. **Note:** the last stitch **before** each SM is a Double Stitch (DS) and is knit as ONE stitch. Remove the SM as you knit the DS.

Row 91 (C1): Sl k, kfb, k125, kfb, p1. (131 sts)

Row 92 (C1): Sl k, k129, p1 in C2.

Row 93 (C2): Sl k, kfb, k127, kfb, p1. (133 sts)

Row 95 (C2): Sl k, kfb, k129, kfb, p1. (135 sts)

Row 97 (C2): Sl k, kfb, k131, kfb, p1. (137 sts)

Row 98 (C2): Sl k, k135, p1 in C1.

Row 99 (C1): Sl k, kfb, k133, kfb, p1. (139 sts)

Row 100 (C1): Sl k, k137, p1 in C2.

Row 101 (C2): Sl k, kfb, k35

Knit Lace Wedge in C2

When **Lace Wedge** is finished, knit to last 2 stitches of **Row 101**, kfb, p1. (141 sts)

Note: (Row 101 and Row 102) The last stitch **before** a SM is a DS and is knit ONE stitch. Remove SM as you knit the DS.

Row 102 (WS) (C2): Sl k, k139, p1 in C1.

Row 103 (C 1): Sl k, kfb, k137, kfb, p1. (143 sts)

Row 105 (C1): Sl k, kfb, k139, kfb, p1. (145 sts)

Row 107 (C1): Sl k, kfb, k141, kfb, p1. (147 sts)

Row 108 (C1): Sl k, k145, p1 in C2.

Row 109 (C2): Sl k, kfb, k143, kfb, p1. (149 sts)

Row 110 (C2): Sl k, k147, p1 in C1.

Row 111 (C1): Sl k, kfb, k145, kfb, p1. (151 sts) Leave C1 and move the stitches back to the other end of your circular needle to be knit again, this time using C2 (from the right side).

Knit Right Edge Wedge Increase in C2. When **Right Edge Wedge Increase** is finished, the stitches are moved back to the other end of your circular needle, to continue with C1 on the wrong side.

Row 112 (C1): Sl k, p159. **Note:** the first stitch **after** each SM is a Double Stitch (DS) and is purled as ONE stitch. Remove the SM as you purl the DS.

Row 113 (C1): Sl k, kfb, k156, kfb, p1. (162 sts)

Row 114 (C1): Sl k, k160, p1 in C2.

Row 115 (C2): Sl k, kfb, k158, kfb, p1. (164 sts)

Row 116 (C2): Sl k, k162, p1 in C1.

Row 117 (C1): Sl k, kfb, k160, kfb, p1. (166 sts)

Knit Left Edge Wedge Increase in C1

Knit One Colour Wedge C1

When **One Colour Wedge** is finished, knit to last 2 stitches of **Row 133**: kfb, p1.

Note: (Row 133 and Row 134) The last stitch **before** a SM is a DS and is knit as ONE stitch. Remove SM as you knit the DS.

Row 134 (C1): Sl k, k175, p1 in C2.

Row 135 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k172, kfb, p1.

Row 137 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k172, kfb, p1.

Row 139 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k172, kfb, p1.

Row 140 (C2): Sl k, k175, p1 in C1.

Row 141 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k65

Knit One Colour Wedge C1

When **One Colour Wedge** is finished, knit to last 2 stitches of **Row 141**: kfb, p1.

Note: (Row 141 and Row 142) The last stitch **before** a SM is a DS and is knit as ONE stitch. Remove SM as you knit the DS.

Row 142 (C1): Sl k, k175, p1 in C2.

Row 143 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k172, kfb, p1.

Row 145 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k172, kfb, p1.

Row 147 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k172, kfb, p1.

Row 148 (C2): Sl k, k175, p1 in C1.

Row 149 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k172, kfb, p1.

Row 150 (C1): Sl k, k175, p1 in C2.

Row 151 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k172, kfb, p1.

Row 160 (C2): Sl k, p167. **Note:** the first stitch **after** each SM is a Double Stitch (DS) and is purled as ONE stitch. Remove the SM as you purl the DS.

Row 161 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k163, kfb, p1.

Row 162 (C2): Sl k, k166, p1 in C1.

Row 163 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k163, kfb, p1.

Row 164 (C1): Sl k, k166, p1 in C2.

Row 165 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k163, kfb, p1.

Knit Left Edge Wedge Increase in C2

Row 166 (C2): Sl k, k175, p1 in C1. **Note:** the last stitch **before** each SM is a Double Stitch (DS) and is knit as ONE stitch. Remove the SM as you knit the DS.

Repeat from Row 121 until desired length, measured along the edge with the increases.

Row 177 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k161, k2tog, p1.

Row 178 (C2): Sl k, k163, p1 in C1.

Row 179 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k159, k2tog, p1.

Row 180 (C1): Sl k, k161, p1 in C2.

Row 181 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k157, k2tog, p1.

Row 182 (C2): Sl k, k159, p1 in C1.

Row 183 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k65

Knit One Colour Wedge in C1

When **One Colour Wedge** is finished, knit to last 3 stitches of **Row 183**, k2tog, p1.

The last stitch **before** a SM is a DS and is knit as one stitch. Remove SM as you knit the DS.

Row 184 (C1): Sl k, k157, p1 in C2.

Row 185 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k153, k2tog, p1.

Row 186 (C2): Sl k, k155, p1 in C1.

Row 187 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k151, k2tog, p1.

Row 189 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k149, k2tog, p1.

Row 191 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k147, k2tog, p1.

Leave C1 and move the stitches back to the other end of your circular needle to be knit again, this time using C2 (from the right side).

Knit **Right Edge Wedge Decrease in C2**. When **Right Edge Wedge Decrease** is finished, the stitches are moved back to the other end of your circular needle, to continue with C1 on the wrong side.

Row 192 (C1): Sl k, p141. **Note:** the first stitch **after** each SM is a Double Stitch (DS) and is purled as ONE stitch. Remove the SM as you purl the DS.

Row 193 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k136, k2tog, p1.

Row 194 (C1): Sl k, k138, p1 in C2.

Row 195 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k134, k2tog, p1.

Row 196 (C2): Sl k, k136, p1 in C1.

Row 197 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k132, k2tog, p1.

Knit Left Edge Wedge Decrease in C1

Row 198 (C1): Sl k, k125, p1 in C2. **Note:** the last stitch **before** each SM is a Double Stitch (DS) and is knit as ONE stitch. Remove the SM as you knit the DS.

Row 199 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k121, k2tog, p1.

Row 200 (C2): Sl k, k123, p1 in C1.

Row 201 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k119, k2tog, p1.

Row 203 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k75,

Knit Lace Wedge in C2

When **Lace Wedge** is finished, knit to last 3 stitches of **Row 203**: k2tog, p1.

Row 204 (C2): Sl k, k119, p1 in C1. **Note:** the last stitch **before** a SM is a DS and is knit as ONE stitch. Remove the SM as you knit the DS.

Row 205 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k115, k2tog, p1.

Row 207 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k113, k2tog, p1.

Row 209 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k111, k2tog, p1.

Row 210 (C1): Sl k, k113, p1 in C2.

Row 211 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k109, k2tog, p1.

Row 212 (C2): Sl k, k111, p1 in C1.

Row 213 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k107, k2tog, p1.

Row 215 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k105, k2tog, p1.

Row 217 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k103, k2tog, p1.

Row 218 (C1): Sl k, k105, p1 in C2.

Row 219 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k101, k2tog, p1.

Row 220 (C2): Sl k, k103, p1 in C1.

Row 221 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k99, k2tog, p1.

Leave C2 and move the stitches back to the other end of your circular needle to be knit again, this time using C1 (from the right side).

Knit **Right Edge Wedge Decrease in C1**. When **Right Edge Wedge Decrease** is finished, the stitches are moved back to the other end of your circular needle, to continue with C2 on the wrong side.

Row 228 (C2): Sl k, p87. **Note:** the first stitch **after** each SM is a Double Stitch (DS) and is purled as ONE stitch. Remove the SM as you purl the DS.

Row 229 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k82, k2tog, p1.

Row 230 (C2): Sl k, k84, p1 in C1.

Row 231 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k80, k2tog, p1.

Row 232 (C1): Sl k, k82, p1 in C2.

Row 233 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k78, k2tog, p1.

Knit Left Edge Wedge Decrease in C2

Row 234 (C2): Sl k, k71, p1 in C1. **Note:** the last stitch **before** each SM is a Double Stitch (DS) and is knit as ONE stitch. Remove the SM as you knit the DS.

Row 235 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k67, k2tog, p1.

Row 236 (C1): Sl k, k69, p1 in C2.

Row 237 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k65, k2tog, p1.

Row 238 (C2): Sl k, k67, p1 in C1.

Row 239 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k25,

Knit One Colour Wedge in C1

When **One Colour Wedge** is finished, knit to last 3 stitches of **Row 239**: k2tog, p1.

The last stitch before a SM is a DS and is knit as one stitch. Remove SM as you knit the DS.

Row 240 (C1): Sl k, k65, p1 in C2.

Row 241 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k61, k2tog, p1.

Row 242 (C2): Sl k, k63, p1 in C1.

Row 243 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k59, k2tog, p1. Leave C1 and move the stitches back to the other end of your circular needle to be knit again, this time using C2 (from the right side).

Knit **Right Edge Wedge Decrease in C2**. When **Right Edge Wedge Decrease** is finished, the stitches are moved back to the other end of your circular needle, to continue with C1 on the wrong side.

Row 244 (C1): Sl k, p53. **Note:** the first stitch **after** each SM is a Double Stitch (DS) and is purled as ONE stitch. Remove the SM as you purl the DS.

Row 245 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k48, k2tog, p1.

Row 246 (C1): Sl k, k50, p1 in C2.

Row 247 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k46, k2tog, p1.

Row 248 (C2): Sl k, k48, p1 in C1.

Row 249 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k44, k2tog, p1.

Knit **Left Edge Wedge Decrease in C1**

Row 250 (C1): Sl k, k37, p1 in C2. **Note:** the last stitch **before** each SM is a Double Stitch (DS) and is knit as ONE stitch. Remove the SM as you knit the DS.

Row 251 (C2): Sl k, k2tog, k33, k2tog, p1.

Row 252 (C2): Sl k, k35, p1 in C1.

Row 253 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k31, k2tog, p1.

Row 255 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k29, k2tog, p1.

Row 257 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k27, k2tog, p1.

Row 259 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k25, k2tog, p1.

Row 261 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k23, k2tog, p1.

Row 263 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k21, k2tog, p1.

Row 265 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k19, k2tog, p1.

Row 267 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k17, k2tog, p1.

Row 269 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k15, k2tog, p1.

Row 271 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k13, k2tog, p1.

Row 273 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k11, k2tog, p1.

Row 275 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k9, k2tog, p1.

Row 277 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k7, k2tog, p1.

Row 279 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k5, k2tog, p1.

Row 281 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k3, k2tog, p1.

Row 283 (C1): Sl k, k2tog, k1, k2tog, p1.

Row 284 (C1): Sl k, k3, p1.

Cut the yarn and pull the yarn end through the last 5 stitches, from the left edge, and pull tight.

Finishing:

You will now wet block your shawl, using a mild wool wash and lukewarm water bath. Place your shawl into the wool wash bath, letting it soak for 15 to 20 minutes. Then, gently squeeze out the excess water. Place the shawl into an absorbent towel, roll it up and squeeze out all excess water. Repeat this step if necessary, using an additional dry towel.

Lay the shawl to dry on blocking mats and carefully shape it. You can use shawl pins or blocking wires to hold it in place to shape while fully drying.

It is important to remember not to leave your shawl to block on a towel, as this will take a much longer time for it to dry.

Once the shawl is dry, clip off all of the tail-ends.
