

Deep Winter Hat



Construction Notes:

Worked in the round from the brim to the crown, the Deep Winter hat is the perfect one skein DK knit!

Starting with a twisted ribbing, the hat is then worked by following a chart up the body and through the crown.

(Written instructions included.)

The crown is closed by threading yarn through the remaining stitches, pulling tight and weaving thread in.

The hat can be worn with a folded brim for extra warmth, or unfolded for a slouchy look.

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Yarn

The Farmer's Daughter Fibers Bear Paw DK

60% SW Merino, 20% Silk, and 20% Yak - 231 yards 211meters/100g

150 (170, 190, 200, 220) yards - 137 (155, 173, 183, 202) meters

Needles

US 5 (3.75mm) 16-40" circular needles

US 8 (5.00mm) 16-40" circular needles

Gauge

Unstretched: horizontal gauge: 2.25" per chart repeat

Finished measurements

When choosing your size, for best results measure your head

To fit: 14-16" (17-18", 18-20", 20-22", 23-24") size head

35-41 (43-46, 46-51, 51-56, 58-61)cm head

If making to donate or as a gift, follow suggested ages

To fit: Baby (toddler, kids, adult S, adult L)

Abbreviations

-  • 2/1LC - place 2sts on CN, hold to front, k1, k2 from CN.
-  • 2/1RC - place 1st on CN, hold to back, k2, k1 from CN.
-  • 2/1LPC - place 2sts on CN, hold to front, p1, k2 from CN.
-  • 2/1RPC - place 1st on CN, hold to back, k2, p1 from CN.
-  • 2/2LC - place 2sts on CN, hold to front, k2, k2 from CN.
-  • 2/2RC - place 2sts on CN, hold to back, k2, k2 from CN.
- BOR - Beginning of round
- Cn - cable needle
-  • CDD - center double decrease
- CO - cast on
-  • K – knit
-  • K2tog – knit 2 together
- Ktbl – knit through the back loop
-  • No stitch
- Rep – repeat
-  • P - purl
-  • P2tog - purl 2 together
- Pm - place marker
-  • SSK - slip slip knit
- St(s) - stitch(es)

A) Width: 5.5 (6.75, 6.75, 7.75, 9)"

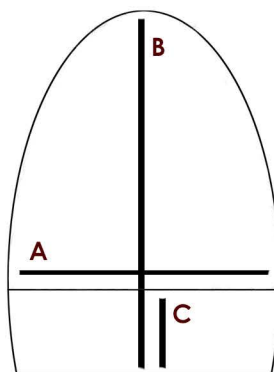
14.5 (17, 17, 20, 23)cm

B) Length: 7.5 (8.5, 9.5, 10.5, 11.25)"

19 (21, 24, 26.5, 28.5)cm

C) Brim Length: 2 (2.25, 2.5, 3, 3)"

5 (5.75, 6.5, 7.5, 7.5)cm



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Password: CABLEKNIT

- Ribbed Cast on
- Work cables without cable needles
- Finishing the crown



1. Brim

1. In smaller needles using the Ribbed Cast On method, CO 80 (96, 96, 112, 128)sts, place BOR marker and join in the round.
2. Work in a *ktbl, p1* ribbing for 2 (2.25, 2.5, 3, 3)".

2. Body

1. Switch to larger needles and start working chart at round 19 (13, 11, 7, 1). *Chart repeated 5 (6, 6, 7, 8) times per round.*
2. Work through to round 63. *Your hat should now be 7.5 (8.5, 9.5, 10.5, 11.25)" long including the brim.*

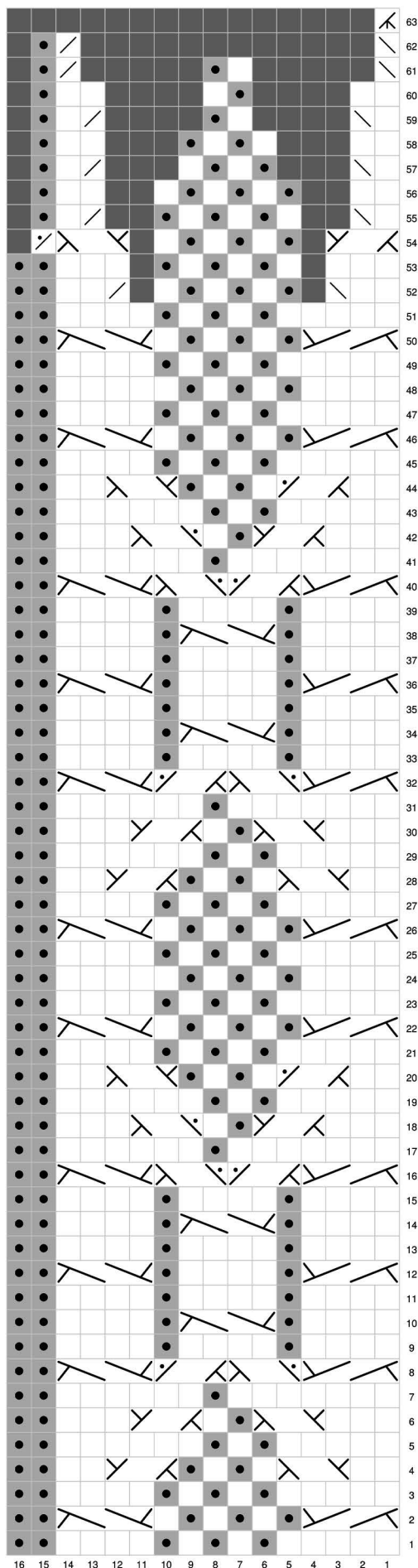
3. Finishing

1. Cut your working yarn with an 10" tail and thread it through your remaining sts, pulling tight.
2. Weave in your remaining ends.
3. Block or steam gently.
4. Wear with brim folded or unfolded for a slouchy look.
5. Add pom pom if desired, wear and be fabulous!
